X students had signed up, and all were notified by email using the registration tool. - 3. Lions Club of Bellingham: Javon and I presented to the Belllingham Lions Club last Thursday for some funding. Mark Costello, who is a building designer in town, got the ball rolling for us on this and I will meet with him shortly to work on writing a grant from Lions Club.
- 4.Hardware Sales: Will give one time donations to non profits and also working on setting up a 10% discount for WMBC.
- 5. After School Ride Programs new membership drive has been frustrating for both Ride Leaders and Students as website not easy to navigate and we are unable to track efficiently our memberships stemming directly from this program. Picked up checks from Happy Valley and left stickers.
- 6.Need more stickers when I pick up checks from schools to leave with them.
- 7. NW Recycling: Picked up metal from Fairhaven Bike shop and took it to NW Recycling to see what that looks like and if worth our time to pick up metal from shops etc. . Didn't have a full truck load, but had about 400 lbs..equaled \$14 for WMBC.
- 8. Shaums gave \$500 to WMBC this spring to offset his rate increase for Ride Leader Certification. Would like to use that for scholarships for low income kids that couldn't get into their schools' after school ride program. Give \$500 worth of scholarships to kids to attend March Northwest Early Release Thursday program.
- **P.R.** Alex Halvorson is writing an article on WMBC youth programs in the WWU magazine the Klipsun. He interviewed myself and Javon.

Future Program: Middle School/High School Ride/Race team. Josh Wilson is working with Washington Student Cycling League as a coach this year with Becca Margulies. They are interested in creating our own program in Bellingham that is more in the style of the riding that most of the kids do up here. I think it would be

	great, especially when we will be able to host our own local race series on Galby. Bike Fleet for this program would be great!. Talking to Jessica Sankey about using the Bellingham School District High School Fleet. She is very interested. Race Series: lets talk about what that could look like and also start getting that rolling so we are ready when the Use Easement is completed.

Eric will give names of those to be interviewed and other focus on workings of WMBC and riding in Bellingham. Film will be submitted to festivals when complete. Larabee race fairly successful but parking is big issue and needs to be addressed for future races. June 2nd DNR trail day. Summer trail days are in planning. Climbing trail to Galbraith is a go and in outline with more planning in fall. Planted Yellow Alaska Cedar trees for future harvesting in conjunction with Freehub. The Bears will be harvested so work will be done on it later. New maps out in about 10 days.
